1. VIRGINIA PHILLIPS. 'DALMENY' 4 OLD BULL CREEK ROAD STRATHALBYN

A large, old style garden hidden behind an all concealing hedge with a circular drive bordered by roses and many intriguing nooks and crannies to explore.

2. JENNY & DAVID THOMAS. 14 TAYLORS LANE STRATHALBYN

Mostly natives interspersed with "what seemed like a good idea at the time". (Jenny's description!)

3. REN TREMAYNE & CHARLES BRITTLEBANK 62 DRY PLAINS ROAD STRATHALBYN

A large rural garden with areas of dry shade, roses, cottage garden, vegetables and an orchard with espaliered trees and lots of good ideas.
